Summary:

To curb the country's exploding population, China limits most families to one child, or in certain circumstances, two children. Due to cultural, social, and economic factors, traditional preference leans towards boys, so girls are often hidden, aborted, or abandoned. As a result, thousands of girls end up in orphanages across China. Today, more than one-quarter of all babies adopted from abroad by American families come from China-and nearly all are girls. Lisa Ling joins some of these families as they travel to China to meet their new daughters for the first time.

Vocabulary: Main vocabulary that is used in the DVD.

1. **Prostitution** (noun) - the act or practice of providing sexual services to another person in return for payment.

2. **Abortion** (noun) - A medical operation to end a pregnancy so that the baby is not born alive.
Ex) *She decided she did not want to have a child so she had an abortion.*
3. **Abduct** (verb) - To take someone away by force; kidnap.
Ex) *The woman abducted by two men she did not know.*
4. **Proactive** (adj.) - Making things happen or change rather than reacting to events
Ex) *The company took a proactive approach to staffing requirements and hired more employees before it go to busy.*
5. **Orphanage** (noun) - A large house where children who have no parents live and are taken care of.
Ex) *He was raised in an orphanage after both of his parents were killed.*
