Summary:

Born in the farmlands of Whitney, Idaho, Ezra Taft Benson learned to love the land. The work ethic and dedication to farming gained in his youth carried him through a lifetime of service and leadership. Loyalty to God, family, and country guided his thoughts and actions always. As a missionary, leader of the nation's farmers, U.S. Cabinet member, apostle, prophet, and father, he left no doubt as to his ethics and beliefs. He was an influential champion of liberty and freedom, and became the greatest advocate of the Book of Mormon in our day.

3. **Epidemic** (noun) — a widespread occurrence of a disease in a community.
Ex: The epidemic last year almost killed all of the children in the tiny village.
4. **Street meeting** (noun) — an event when missionaries would teach crowds of people on the streets (instead of in their homes)
Ex: Elder Smith and Elder Black taught 37 people in last night's street meeting.
5. **Lucrative** (adj) — advantageous; profitable; resulting in a lot of wealth or money.

Ex: The dealer's offer was very lucrative; he would pay me \$4000 for my 10 year old broken car.
