- English 101: Failing grades varied in English 101. For all students and domestic students, failing grades increased. For international (non-IWORK) students, failing grades decreased. Of particular interest, for I-WORK students there was a large increase. English 101 failing grades for I-WORK students could be an indication that some students may not be prepared well enough to succeed in college-level English courses before they are tested out of the EIL program. This finding correlates with the recent ELT Program Review which will be discussed later in this section.
- **English 201:** Failing grades in English 201 decreased for all students and domestic students. For International (non-IWORK) and I-WORK students, there was a slight decrease in failing grades.
- English 315: Failing grades in English 315 for all students decreased. For domestic students, there
  was a slight increase in failing grades. For International (non-IWORK) students, failing grades
  actually decreased. However, for I-WORK students there was an increase in failing grades.
- History 201: Failing grades in History 201 for all students decreased. Domestic students' failing
  grades increased slightly. For International (non-IWORK) students, failing grades dropped
  substantially, and for I-WORK students, there was a gradual decrease.
- History 202: Failing grades in History 202 for all students decreased. Domestic students' failing
  grades also decreased. For International (non-IWORK) students, there was a decrease in failing
  grades, however, for I-WORK students there was a gradual increase.
- Biology 100: Failing grades in Biology 100 decreased slightly for all students and domestic students.
   For International (non-IWORK) students, failing grades decreased slightly, and for I-WORK students, there was also a decrease.

- Math 106: Failing grades in Math 106 increased substantially for all students and domestic students. For international (non-IWORK) students failing grades remained virtually the same.
   However, there was a major increase in failing grades for I-WORK students. Failing math grades for some students could be an indication that they are having difficulty in reading and understanding math problems.
- Math 110: Failing grades in Math 110 for all students decreased. For domestic students, failing grades increased. For international (non-IWORK) students, failing grades also increased. A larger number of I-WORK students actually had failing grades in Math 110, but overall, there was a decrease.
- **IDS courses**: Failing grades in IDS courses for all students stayed about the same. For domestic students, failing grades increased. For International (non-IWORK) and I-WORK students, failing grades decreased slightly.
