All applications go through a holistic review process. You should take the application for admission seriously and the work submitted should be your own. Your application should illustrate your efforts, accomplishments, and goals.

There is no secret formula for admission to BYU. All applications go through a holistic review, meaning everything in the application is considered. Take the opportunity to tell us about yourself. Make sure the work is your own and be thorough. Your application, including your essays, should demonstrate your preparation in these four areas:

SPIRITUALLY STRENGTHENING

"The founding charge of BYU is to teach every subject with the Spirit." BYU provides a world-class education within a spiritual environment. To help you feel comfortable here, we recommend attending, participating in, and graduating from the Church's seminary program. We also recommend that you regularly participate in church meetings, programs, and activities. If you are spiritually prepared, BYU will provide you with the opportunity to strengthen your testimony of the gospel of Jesus Christ while studying for your degree.

INTELLECTUALLY ENLARGING

"Members of the BYU community rigorously study academic subjects in the light of divine truth." To be prepared academically, we recommend you take challenging, college preparatory classes during high school. We also encourage you to pursue your passions inside and outside of the classroom. Your academic preparation will allow you to learn from BYU's faculty and even work alongside them in your research and fieldwork.

CHECKLISTS

- Live the standards of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.
- Attend and graduate from seminary. After high school, attend institute of religion classes if not attending a Church school.
- Participate in meaningful service opportunities.
- Enroll in quality coursework in high school and college. Recommended high school courses:
 - 4 years of mathematics
 - 4 years of **English**
 - 2-3 years of **laboratory science**
 - 2 years of history or government
 - 2 or more years of foreign language
- We recommend AP/IB courses if available
- Take the ACT/SAT at least twice we will use your highest composite score.*
- Get involved in extracurricular activities; develop your specific talents.
- Plan to provide specific examples of how you have contributed in meaningful ways as you write your application essays.

With the exception of ACT or SAT test scores (see more information below) all materials must be received or reported by the appropriate application deadline. If you would like to make any changes to your application after submission (including submitting transcripts, etc.) you will be required to withdraw your application and then resubmit. This will update the application submission timestamp. Failure to report a complete and accurate academic history, may result in your acceptance being revoked, loss of credit, or dismissal from the institution.

ACT/SAT Scores

Due to the limited availability of ACT and SAT exam options during the COVID-19 global pandemic, most applicants are not required to submit a standardized test score to be considered for admission to BYU for spring, summer, fall 2021 and winter 2022. Applicants may choose to submit a test score if they feel it would strengthen their application; however, applicants who do not submit a test score will not be at a disadvantage. Applicants will be able to submit their application without an ACT or SAT test score by either the priority or final deadline. However, applicants will need to submit an official score by the date listed in the ACT/SAT deadline column if they would like it considered in their evaluation.

*If you or your high school opted for pass/fail grades for the semester(s) or term(s) impacted by COVID-19, this will not have a negative impact on your admission application to BYU.

Utah Public High Schools – If you have attended a Utah public high school, we can retrieve your transcript from the state electronically by your entering your State Student Identifier (SSID) in your application. If this number is not located on your transcript, please contact your high school counseling center to obtain your SSID. (Note: this is not your school-issued ID number).

Non-Utah and other High Schools – You will self-report your high school work in your application. You only need to supply an official transcript if you are admitted. This can be done in one of the following ways:



The admission application requires a few different recommendations. Plan ahead. It is your responsibility to work with your ecclesiastical leaders, seminary teachers, and other recommenders to ensure that their recommendations get submitted in time.

APPLY NOW!

Recommendations are completed through the application with a provided form. Only recommendations asked for and submitted using the application form will be accepted or considered for admission purposes. Any additional recommendations will not be considered, made part of an application, or kept. Recommendation types are listed below:

- 1. Ecclesiastical endorsement All applicants will need to have an ecclesiastical endorsement. This includes agreeing to abide by the Honor Code and Dress and Grooming Standards. Members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints will need to meet with the bishop and a member of their stake presidency from the ward/stake in which their records are located. Currently-serving missionaries will have one interview with their mission president. If you are not a member of the Church, you have the option of completing the endorsement with your own religious leader or with a local bishop or mission president of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (to find a local Latter-day Saint leader, enter your address into the meetinghouse locator tool).
- Seminary Recommendation If required, a request will be sent to your seminary teacher to complete a recommendation.
- 3. **High School Teacher** The high school teacher recommendation can be completed by anyone that taught a class that counted towards the completion of either a math, English, or science requirement in your junior or senior year of high school. You will need to supply their email address in your application.





Am I an International Applicant?

The application will give you an opportunity to say whether you are a U.S. citizen or a dual citizen with the United States, a Permanent Resident (process is complete with "green card"), or whether you are an International Applicant. BYU defines "international applicant" as one who is required to enter the United States with a visa. Applicants with a U.S. passport are not international. Please select the appropriate citizenship in the application.

When Should I Apply?

The application takes time. It can take up to 6 weeks to finish, not counting the time necessary to obtain required exams. Keep aware of the **application deadlines**. All required application materials*, including evaluations of academic records, English proficiency exams, recommendations, etc. must be completed by the appropriate deadline.

Have you completed any academic work outside the United States? It will need to be evaluated by a transcript evaluation service.

All secondary education and college work (not U.S. accredited) done outside of the United States must be evaluated by an international credential evaluation agency at the applicant's expense. This includes work that may have been evaluated by your U.S. accredited institution and is reported on the high school or university transcript.

CES schools (BYU, BYU-Hawaii, BYU-Idaho, BYU-Pathway, Ensign College) will accept evaluations from International Education Research Foundation (IERF) and SpanTran.

Please note that even if you are applying to multiple CES institutions, only one evaluation is required.

For IERF users: When **applying for the evaluation online**, be sure to select BYU-Undergraduate as the recipient, as IERF works with a number of BYU departments. This will ensure that your report reaches the correct office. Also, when selecting report type, you must select "detail report." View **this video** for more instructions.

For SpanTran users: Please use the form provided on their website (**spantran.com/byu-ces**) to ensure we get the correct report (Course Analysis) for high school (secondary education) documents as well as college/university documents. This website will link to a webpage that will help identify the required documentation to submit.

DO NOT send your transcripts directly to us unless they are submitted by an accredited U.S. institution. We will discard any international transcripts that are not properly evaluated.

Is English your second language? You may be required to submit a test of English proficiency as a part of the application.

In order to ensure that our applicants will succeed in BYU's intense academic environment, a test of English proficiency may be required. We require proof of proficiency regardless of time spent studying in the United States. TOEFL, IELTS, and PTE scores are valid for two years. If the exam expires before the application deadline, a new score will be required. The Cambridge English exams do not expire. Please note that meeting minimum requirements will not guarantee admission.

BYU accepts English proficiency exams from TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, and Cambridge English: Advanced. BYU only accepts TOEFL iBT® scores from a single test date, not MyBest™ scores.



Immigration Information



International students who are admitted to the university will need to verify finances and meet other requirements in the first year. You will need to complete the following requirements:

VISA POLICY

Your visa is placed in your passport at a U.S. Department of State Embassy or Consulate outside of the U.S. It is your permit allowing you to travel to a U.S. port of entry and to request entry as a non-immigrant.

Once an international student has been admitted to a degree-seeking program at BYU, and completed the financial requirements, the university will provide the Form I-20 for the visa application. If a student's visa application is denied, BYU will not intervene in the process, unless the government requests additional information directly from the university.

Admitted international students with a B-1/B-2 or F-2 visa will not be permitted to enroll at the university until they have secured F-1 visa status. Students should not attempt to enter the United States as a degree-seeking student without presenting a Form I-20, a valid visa (except Canadians and Bermudians), and valid passport.

Please refer to the **International Student and Scholar Services website** for additional information.

FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Federal financial aid is not available to international students, and you should not include the assistance of U.S. government resources when calculating your financial plan. Freshman applicants may qualify for highly competitive academic scholarships. Transfer applicants may be considered for other non-academic scholarships only if they are applying for fall semester and meet the December 15

deadline (see deadlines). In all cases, to be eligible for BYU scholarships, students must submit the scholarship application.

FINANCIAL REQUIREMENTS

International students who are admitted to BYU will need to complete the following requirements before receiving the Form I-20 and registering for classes:

- Financial Verification All admitted international students must provide verification that they are able to meet the cost of attendance. You must complete an Affidavit of Support accompanied with the most recent copy of the bank statement for each sponsor before you are able to register for classes.
- International Student Deposit Once admitted to the university, all international students must make a deposit of \$4000 USD before they will be able to register for classes. The deposit will be held in an interest-earning escrow account with the intent to be released to the student during their final semester before graduation. Once the deposit has been paid and finances have been verified, the registration hold will be removed. There are no exceptions to this requirement. Read the full Deposit Policy here.

Sponsors

Generally speaking, international students require the support of a sponsor to prove financial ability. Students are responsible for securing this sponsor (i.e., parents, government, other). This individual (or these individuals) should be a viable financial resource to the student.

The Visiting Student Program is for high school graduates who are (or will be) pursuing a degree at another college, but wish to have a BYU experience during the spring and/or summer.

During spring and/or summer term, high school graduates who are (or will be) actively pursuing a degree at another college or university are invited to be a part of the BYU community as non-degree-seeking students. While on campus, students in the program will enroll in college-level courses and also enjoy a wide range of BYU cultural and social experiences.

Because of the level of intellectual, social, and emotional maturity required of university students, BYU does not admit applicants who will be less than 17 years of age by the first day of class.

Former students are not eligible to apply for the Visiting Student program.

To be competitive for admission consideration as a visiting student, students will need:

- · High school GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Composite ACT score of 18 or SAT of 860 (total of critical reading and math scores only)
- College/university GPA of 2.5 or higher

Admission and enrollment in the BYU Visiting Student Program does not in any way imply continued enrollment at BYU beyond summer term. Students wanting to pursue a degree at BYU must submit an application for undergraduate admission and meet the admission criteria in effect at the time of application.



The Concurrent Enrollment program is for local high school students interested in taking college classes before graduating.

Many students choose to complete college coursework while still attending high school. These concurrent enrollment classes can help you fulfill general education requirements, while also helping you get a feel for what college is really like.

If you would like to participate in BYU concurrent enrollment classes, you must be a local high school student. You must also meet the following criteria:

- Complete the General Student Information and Ecclesiastical Endorsement parts of the online application at **apply.byu.edu** (remember to apply under the "concurrent enrollment" status)
- · Complete junior year of high school and be at least 16 years old
- Have an unweighted cumulative GPA of 3.70 or higher
- Indicate unconditional support from your high school counselor and parent
- Agree to enroll in no more than 11.5 hours during fall and winter semesters and no more than 5.5 hours during spring and summer terms
- All concurrent enrollment applicants must submit an ACT or SAT score

You must also fill out the concurrent enrollment voucher.

Note: A new concurrent enrollment voucher must be submitted for each enrollment at BYU.



The purpose of this program is to assist a limited number of students who have a bachelor's degree but are not enrolled in a graduate program.

Note: This program is not to be confused with BYU Graduate Studies.

Students who have already earned a bachelor's degree and are not enrolled in a graduate program are not normally admissible to BYU; however, the post-baccalaureate program is designed to allow this kind of student limited access to university resources. The program is usually only available during spring and summer terms (fall and winter resources on campus are reserved for undergraduate students and students who have been officially admitted into a graduate or undergraduate program).

The purpose of this program is to assist a limited number of students who have a bachelor's degree but are not enrolled in a graduate program. Reasons for attending as a post-baccalaureate student are many and varied; a common reason may be students looking for a few more classes to be eligible to apply for a master's program. To be considered for admission to the post-baccalaureate studies program, students should apply online.

Applicants wishing to apply as post-baccalaureates must complete the explanation essay in the essay portion of the application. Applicants should give as much detail as possible regarding the length of time they plan to enroll, the specific coursework needed, and the reasons for specifically attending BYU. Applicants just looking to take a class for personal enrichment, who are pursuing a worthy hobby, or are simply satisfying intellectual curiosity should seek enrollment through continuing education options such as **Evening Classes**, **Salt Lake Center**, and **Independent Study**.

If you or your child is homeschooled, you may be wondering how different the admission process is for homeschooled applicants. Fortunately, the admission process is very similar!

As part of the application, homeschooled applicants will be required to submit any high school or university work completed through an institution accredited by a regional accrediting agency.

If you will not graduate from an accredited high school or complete secondary school through home schooling as required by your state, you may be required to submit a GED or state-recognized high school equivalency exam. If this is a requirement for you, it will be listed on the status page of your online admission application.

Any college work completed before you have met the state requirements for completing high school or before completing a GED or state recognized high school equivalency exam will be considered concurrent enrollment work and you will apply as a freshman applicant. If you have already completed your state requirements for high school completion or have taken a GED or state recognized high school equivalency exam and have completed college course work after that date, you may apply as a transfer applicant. If you have not completed sufficient accredited high school work or have not completed 24 graded college credits, you will be required to take an ACT or SAT exam.

There are many benefits of taking AP and IB classes.

See the current guides on which AP or IB test scores qualify for BYU credit here.

BYU encourages students to enroll in AP (Advanced Placement) or IB (International Baccalaureate) classes where available. Following are a few of the major benefits of taking these college prep courses:

- · Because AP and IB courses are measured by a universal standard, students who take these courses will receive extra consideration in the BYU admission process.
- Depending on the number and type of courses taken, students can receive university credit before even graduating from high school.
- Students who take AP or IB courses are usually more prepared for the rigors of college coursework, as well as the ACT/SAT, because of the study skills, discipline, and knowledge gained while taking such courses.
- · Students who take AP and IB courses gain support from motivated peers and mentors.

Is AP/IB right for me?

The decision to take AP or IB courses should be considered carefully by the student, parents, and a school counselor. Students and parents may wish to talk to an AP/IB teacher or coordinator to learn more about the difficulties of a particular course. They will want to be sure to consider the workload and the preparation required for the course. We recommend not taking an AP/IB course unless students can maintain at least a B+ average.





All admitted undergraduate students need to pay a deposit

PAY INTERNATIONAL STUDENT DEPOSIT

In order for students to be successful academically at Brigham Young University (BYU), they must have a solid financial plan. All undergraduate international students (those in F-1 or J-1 status) are required to deposit \$4,000 USD in an escrow account at BYU following notification of admission. Students will not be able to register for classes, nor will any student visa paperwork be initiated until the deposit is paid.

Each of the CES institutions (BYU, BYU-Hawaii, BYU-Idaho, LDS Business College) has their own deposit policy which may allow access to deposit funds under different circumstances. Here at BYU, the deposit will be held in escrow with the intent that it will be released to the student during his or her final semester before graduation. Students who experience unforeseen financial hardship while studying at BYU may petition to use up to \$3,000 of their deposit before their final semester. To petition, please contact the Associate Dean of Students, in person at 3500 WSC, by phone at 801-422-4771, or by email deanofstudents@byu.edu.

International students who find they are unable to cover the costs associated with their continued education at BYU and who have already accessed \$3,000 from their deposit will be granted access to the remaining \$1,000, which is set aside for the student as an emergency fund for the purchase of a plane ticket to return to their home country.





Inspiring Fieldwork



Living in the world's coldest capital city, Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, coal is often the only affordable source of

heat for the traditional ger, a round tent-like construction where the entire family lives. Unfortunately, coal is one of the dirtiest air pollutants and the pollution is so bad that it has severely limited the lung capacity of the capital's children.

BYU engineering students and faculty went to Mongolia committed to solve what seemed like an impossible problem. Simply replacing the coal burning stove at the center of the ger with an electric stove would not be enough. They also needed to find a cost effective way to make gers more energy efficient.


The teams designed solutions at BYU and then tested them on-site in Ulaanbaatar and they worked! For a minimal cost of \$400, the team can retrofit a ger to make it warm, affordable, and above all, safe to live in. Hundreds of gers have been replaced and the hope is that the solution can be provided to thousands in the future.

Inspiring Service



BYU students are using a fish to teach social skills to children with autism. These aren't just any students. One of

the students on this project, Bruna Goncalves, developed a passion for behavioral research while working with her sister who suffers from cystic fibrosis. Dr. Ryan Kellems, assistant professor in counseling psychology and special education, said her unique perspective enriched his research team. And this isn't just any fish. Marla is an animated fish that is controlled by an operator in another room. Her mouth moves in alignment with whatever the operator says into a microphone, allowing her to interact with viewers in real time.

The research team uses Marla the fish because they have found that many children with autism who struggle with conversation and eye contact are riveted by animated characters. Marla could hold their attention long enough that operators could teach the children the steps to start a conversation. After some practice, the children confidently tested their new skills with real people, including other children. Their parents said that the live animation teaching method made a difference in their lives and the lives of their children. Bruna wasn't done with her research when the project was completed. Not only did she help design and conduct the research, she also co-presented the findings with Dr. Kellems at two national conferences and has been accepted to a graduate program.

"I saw kids, who initially hid under the table so they wouldn't have to talk to us, build their confidence and become willing to talk to others even though it was hard for them. Many made new friends, and even taught their peers!"

Inspiring Mentorship

of rheumatic heart disease in the world. Caused by untreated strep throat which can lead to heart damage, the disease can be deadly if untreated. Through a program called Rheumatic Relief, BYU student volunteers and alumni help to screen children for RHD and, working with the Samoan government, refer them for life-saving treatment.

BYU GRADUATES WHO GO ON TO EARN DOCTORATES (National Opinion Research Center)

These BYU students are the first line of diagnosis for possible RHD among the Samoan children. They engage with the children by performing puppet shows in Samoan and teaching songs to help the children know when to seek help for a sore throat. BYU students spend the semester prior to their trip learning these Samoan songs and phrases. As of 2019, more than 30,000 children have been screened and 685 were referred for treatment.



SELECTION

You may live in either on- or BYU-contracted off-campus housing. Most freshmen choose to live on campus their first year, but it is not a requirement. Both dormitory-style (meals provided) and apartment-style (cook your own meals) housing options are available on campus. Additionally, a Foreign Language Student Residence option is available for students who want a unique language immersion experience.

If you wish to live on campus you do not need to complete a separate application for housing. Admitted students are offered on-campus housing in the order they submit their admission application. SCHOLARSHIPS

For scholarship consideration, you must do two things along with your application for admission:

• Submit the BYU Scholarship Application

Prospective new freshmen are eligible to apply for undergraduate scholarships beginning with the term/semester they are admitted. All prospective students must complete a scholarship application by the appropriate deadline in order to be considered. Academic scholarships for freshman students are determined on the basis of academic indicators, including high school grade point averages. For the 2021-22 incoming class, ACT/SAT scores will be optional. However, with or without a test score, we are confident that we have sufficient information to rank students and make meaningful distinctions in awarding scholarships.

In addition to academic scholarships, the BYU
Financial Aid Office offers hundreds of scholarships based on financial need and other criteria.
To apply for these, complete the online scholarship application by the appropriate

scholarship deadline. Also, check with the department and college of your major to explore other opportunities and programspecific aid.

• Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Approximately 42% of enrolled new freshmen receive a scholarship. Additionally, BYU will assist in meeting full Latter-day Saint tuition costs for newly admitted freshmen who:

- · Apply for admission directly out of high school
- Submit the FAFSA by the appropriate scholarship deadline, and qualify for an initial Federal Pell Grant
- Remain in good academic standing (maintain a cumulative 2.00 BYU GPA)

As such, students who qualify for the Cougar Pell Promise will have their tuition costs met each year. Specific details and requirements may be found at cougarpellpromise.byu.edu.



INSPIRING COLLABORATION

In Christianity, Judaism, and Islam, music and scripture are both inseparable and important to worship. As curator of the Sacred Sounds exhibit at the BYU library, music major Maddie Blonquist worked alongside students in media arts, graphic design, French, and Spanish to create an experience that celebrated music in religion.

TIPS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Your preparation is an important component to success in higher education. The following tips can help your application go more smoothly.


- Plan early registration for the ACT/SAT, an English proficiency exam (TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, CAE), and credential evaluation can take several weeks or longer. To avoid rush fees, plan to register for these application requirements at least 2-3 months before the application deadline.
- You should list your name on the application as it appears on your passport. Additionally, to ensure scores submitted electronically are received, the name on the application and on any exams must be exactly the same. Any variation may cause delay.
- An endorsement must be submitted from your ecclesiastical leader on your behalf. If you are not a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latterday Saints you must be interviewed by either your own ecclesiastical leader or a Latter-day Saint bishop as well as the University Chaplain.
- Apply for the semester or term you wish to start. You likely will not be able to change this if admitted.

- If you wish to live on campus you do not need to complete a separate application for housing. Admitted students are offered on-campus housing in the order they submit their admission application. A place in on-campus housing is not guaranteed, but the earlier you submit your admission application, the more likely you are to receive your housing preference.
- If you have attended any U.S. high schools you will need to self-report this work on the application. An official transcript will be required only if you are admitted. Failure to provide accurate information on any portion of the application may result in rescinded admission.
- Admission to one semester or term is not easier than another.
- If you have completed a bachelor's degree you are not eligible for a second bachelor's degree from BYU, but are welcome to apply to BYU graduate programs.
- BYU does not accept transfer applicants that have 90 credits or more.

EVALUATING INTERNATIONAL WORK

All secondary education and college work (not U.S. accredited) done outside the United States must be evaluated by an international credential evaluations agency at the applicant's expense.

You may defer your enrollment (and scholarship, if applicable) for a Latter-day Saint mission by completing a mission deferment form online. The form cannot be submitted until you have been admitted and have received your mission call.

PREPARATION RECOMMENDATIONS

- Live the standards of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.
- Attend and graduate from seminary. After high school, attend institute of religion classes if not attending a CES school.
- · Participate in meaningful service opportunities.
- Get involved in extracurricular activities—develop your specific talents.
- · Be genuine in your application.
- If your native language is not English, you will be required to submit an English Proficiency exam score, regardless of the amount of time spent studying in the United States. See page 11 for accepted tests and minimum requirements
- Plan to provide specific examples of how you have contributed in meaningful ways as you write your application essays.



APPLICATION DEADLINES

Application deadlines are final. In order to submit your application, we must receive ALL application materials—including those submitted by others on your behalf. Any application not submitted by the deadline will not be considered. Note also that because of the level of intellectual, social, and emotional maturity required of university students, BYU does not admit applicants who will be less than 17 years of age by the first day of class.

FINANCIAL AID & SCHOLARSHIPS

Federal financial aid is not available to international students. Freshman applicants may qualify for highly competitive academic scholarships. Transfer applicants may be considered for academic scholarships only if they are applying for fall semester and meet the December 16, 2019 deadline (see page 7). In all cases, to be eligible for BYU scholarships, students must submit the scholarship application (see URL below).



FINANCIAL REQUIREMENTS


International students who are admitted to BYU will need to complete the following requirements before receiving the Form I-20 and registering for classes:

- Financial Verification All admitted international students must provide verification that they are able to meet the cost of attendance for one year. You must complete an Affidavit of Support accompanied with the most recent copy of the bank statement for each sponsor before you are able to register for classes.
- International Student Deposit Once admitted to the university, all international students must make a deposit of \$4,000 USD before they will be able to register for classes. The deposit will be held in an interest-earning escrow account with the intent to be released to the student during their final semester before graduation. Once the deposit has been paid and finances have been verified, the registration hold will be removed. There are no exceptions to this requirement.
- I-20 Transfer Request Form (if applicable) –
 International students who are currently studying
 in the United States will be required to transfer their
 SEVIS record to BYU. A registration hold is placed on
 the student's file until a transfer request form has
 been submitted.

NOTE: The deadline for these three requirements is the same as the financial verification deadline shown on page 7.
