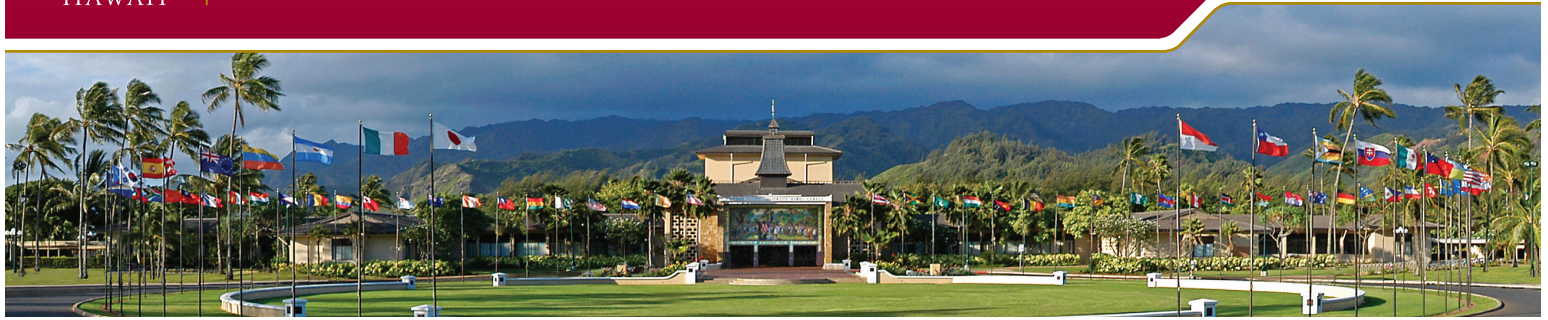




QUICK FACTS: FALL SEMESTER 2013
