- 6. Extrude: (verb) to force out
 - ex: She had a hard time extruding her foot from the small shoe.
- 7. **Feces:** (noun) bodily waste discharged through the anus *ex: Sally was very unhappy when stepped in horse feces with her new, red shoes.*
