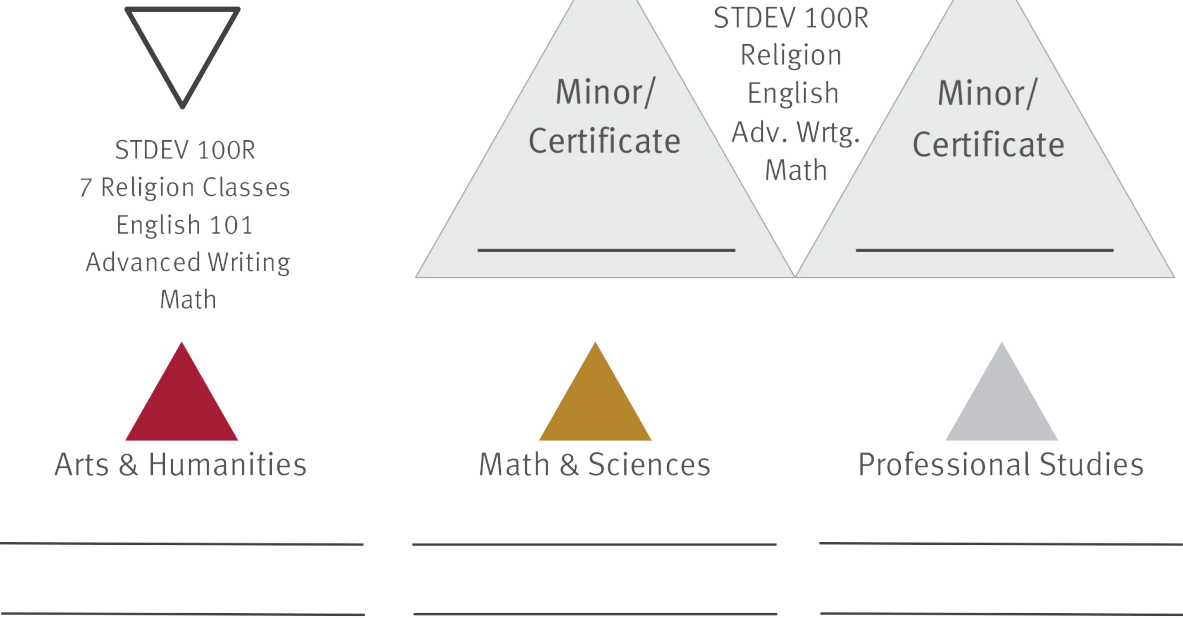

A degree from BYU–Hawaii is made up of four kinds of classes: core classes, classes from the Arts & Humanities category, classes from the Math & Sciences category, and classes from the Professional Studies category.
