1. Prominent Men and Women of the Book of Mormon

A study of the life and times of 26 prominent men and women of the Book of Mormon. Lessons, readings, and learning activities will focus on the lessons for living or gospel principles revealed in the careful examination of the stories of their personal lives and how we can apply them today.

2. Character Traits of the Savior

Using primarily the New Testament Gospels, this course offers an in-depth study of 20 character traits of the Savior, including faith, hope, love, knowledge, patience, humility, diligence, obedience, virtue, temperance, godliness, sincerity, and courage. Students will set goals and strive to become more Christlike as part of the course.

3. Visions and Teachings of the Prophet Joseph Smith

A study of the seventy-six visions of the Prophet Joseph Smith is known to have received, from his First Vision to his last, on the day of his death, and the relevant teachings of the Prophet related to these visions. Students will also learn ways to help others accept him as the prophet of the Restoration.
